1. Approval of the agenda

2. Presentation and approval of the NSI's Activity Report for 2019

3. Presentation of Financial Report for Nov 2018–Nov 2019 and approval of audited accounts.

5. NSI Research Award 2019.

Victor Greiff presented the NSI Research Award 2019 on behalf of the evaluation committee to Lene Støkken Høydahl for the article "Plasma Cells Are the Most Abundant Gluten Peptide MHC-expressing Cells in Inflamed Intestinal Tissues From Patients With Celiac Disease" published in *Gastroenterology* in April 2019.*

6. Travel grant from Per Brandtzaeg's fund for research in mucosal immunology

The grant was awarded for the first time by Inger Sandlie and Petter Brandtzaeg. The grant goes to a postdoc at a Norwegian Research institution who will spend time abroad studying aspects related to mucosal immunology. This year, the grant was awarded to Stian Foss.
