## Speaker Guidelines for the Whole Norway Immunology Journal Club

- 1. Paper Selection: Choose an outstanding primary research paper (not a review!) in the field of immunology. It should be published in the last 12 months in high-impact journals such as Nature, Science, Cell, Immunity, Nature Immunology, or Science Immunology. These journals ensure broader interest. Articles presented at the JC should be of potential interest for anyone working with immunology. [For Principal Investigators (P.I.s): You have the liberty to choose and decide the number of papers to present. However, it is advisable to include at least one paper from the mentioned high-impact journals.]
- 2. **Notification of Paper Selection**: Inform the organizers, Marit and Alex, about your paper choice preferably one week, but at least 2-3 days, prior to your JC session for the email announcement. Some journal club participants wish to read the papers beforehand.
- 3. **Presentation Duration**: Prepare a 20-minute presentation (AND NOT LONGER). This will leave 10 minutes for questions and discussion (e.g. 5 minutes during your presentation and 5 minutes at the end). Encourage audience interaction!
- 4. **Audience Awareness**: The audience consists of a mix of master's students, PhD candidates, postdocs, and P.I.s. Aim to make the paper accessible and engaging to all audience members. Don't be afraid of being too basic.
- 5. **Introduction**: Begin with a 5-minute introduction on the topic. The initial slides should cover basic concepts, akin to a basic immunology course at university level.
- 6. **Slide Design**: Avoid cluttering slides. Break down complex figures into multiple slides for clarity.
- 7. **Text Readability**: Ensure all slide text is large enough to be read from the back of the auditorium.
- 8. **Technical Considerations**: The auditorium (A3.3067 at Rikshospitalet) has a PC with an older version of PowerPoint. If using a Mac, bring your laptop to avoid compatibility issues.
- 9. **Conclusion slide**: Conclude with a slide presenting your thoughts on the paper's main strengths, limitations, and future perspectives.
- 10. **Scheduling**: The first presentation begins at 9:00 am, and the second should conclude by 10:00 am, including questions and discussions. Therefore, the second presentation should start around 9:30 am. [P.I. presentations can last up to 60 minutes and include extensive time for discussion.] By 10:00 am, attendees should feel comfortable leaving.
- 11. Preparation: Remember, thorough preparation is key to a successful presentation!
